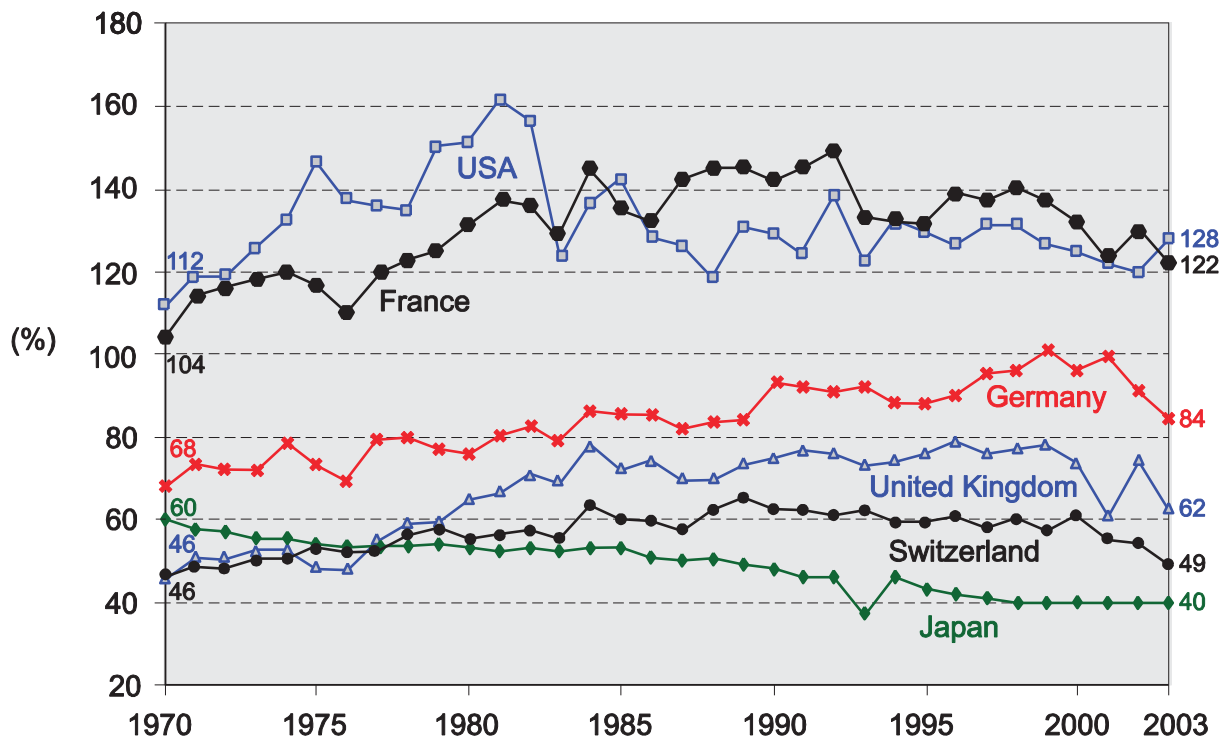
Using the material provided, please write a short essay on the movement of food at a global scale and its broader geographical significance.
